NEWS FROM WORLD HEADQUARTERS

From the Desk of Scarlet Thompson | Executive Vice President

In the last month, staff and volunteers have carried out two conventions, in two different cities. Our first was the Junior Civitan International Convention outside Washington, D.C. where we saw increased attendance and a combination of the event with the longtime fundraiser Dance-a-thon. Less than two weeks later, we executed the 99th annual Civitan International Convention in Greenville, South Carolina. With around 470 Civitans attending, we elected our next International officers, brought back a service project to the event, and celebrated membership and philanthropy successes.

One of the events held alongside the convention was the summer meeting of the Civitan International Board of Directors. Some of the decisions from that meeting included:

- *The approval of a committee to look into and plan for a recommitment to the Civitan International Research Center – The fulfillment of the original \$20 million pledge will happen in less than two years, so it's time to determine what our partnership with the center looks like from here.*
- *A change to the policy regarding Junior Civitan club builders and at what point they're recognized as a master club builder – Now those individuals can be recognized if their clubs had been in existence for five years, instead of all clubs being in existence at time of their fifth club build.*
- *Revisions to a policy regarding Civitan communications as a whole – These changes suggest any external promotions of the organization reflect the parent brand, and not an individual or group of people.*

In addition, the board deeply discussed current situations with districts and their structure as well as International board representation and whether it should be reviewed due to membership size in certain areas.

During the first business session of the convention, Finance and Audit Committee representative and Past International President Bill Buscher shared some recommendations for the 2020 Civitan International budget, which the International Board had approved. Most of these items affect districts or international officers directly, and not the individual member. The overall theme of these recommendations is a continued focus on sending more money to the mission, rather than "ourselves." In addition, a dedication to keeping all accountable for the International policies in play is reflective of the approved recommendations. More detailed information will be sent out to current leadership soon.

If you have any questions or concerns about actions taken on the International level, please do not hesitate to reach out to me or your respective board member/officer.

Thanks to all who attended the Greenville convention or supported the events that coincided with it. We hope everyone had fun, learned a lot, and renewed their passion for Civitan.

RESEARCH

- Currently, there are 100 faculty and staff at the CIRC who are committed to advancing the frontiers of knowledge with IDD.
- A Civitan scientist identified an essential amino acid that could reduce seizure events and improve memory loss in patients after seizures. Nearly 30% of patients with autism experience seizures.
- A Civitan lab uses specially bred zebrafish models of human neuromuscular diseases to study muscle regulation and novel treatments for muscle diseases.
- Civitan scientists identified a drug treatment that may improve language function and brain function for individuals with Rett syndrome.
- CIRC Director, Dr. Greg Powell and his team are actively recruiting a scientist called the Civitan Researcher: Autism and Neurodevelopmental Disorders Researcher. CIRC will allow any qualifying applicant to participate in groundbreaking research.

CLINICAL CARE

- The Civitan Sports Clinic offers a range of clinic-based and community-based services focused on Autism Spectrum Disorder (ASD) available to individuals, families, school personnel, and the community.
- More than 2,000 people from across North America received care through the Clinic in that last year.
- Children can be evaluated for speech delays and behavioral issues in the observation and interpretation of standardized instruments as well as age appropriate activities.
- Individual and family-based programming is available for children from toddlers to young adolescents with a diagnosis of ASD. Intervention emphasis includes self-advocacy, social skills, social interaction, and community participation.
- The Program for Education and Enrichment of Handicapped Children (PEEH) is a 16-week parent-empowered social skills intervention for individuals with ASD. There are taught reciprocal social skills by structure their skills in group sessions.




